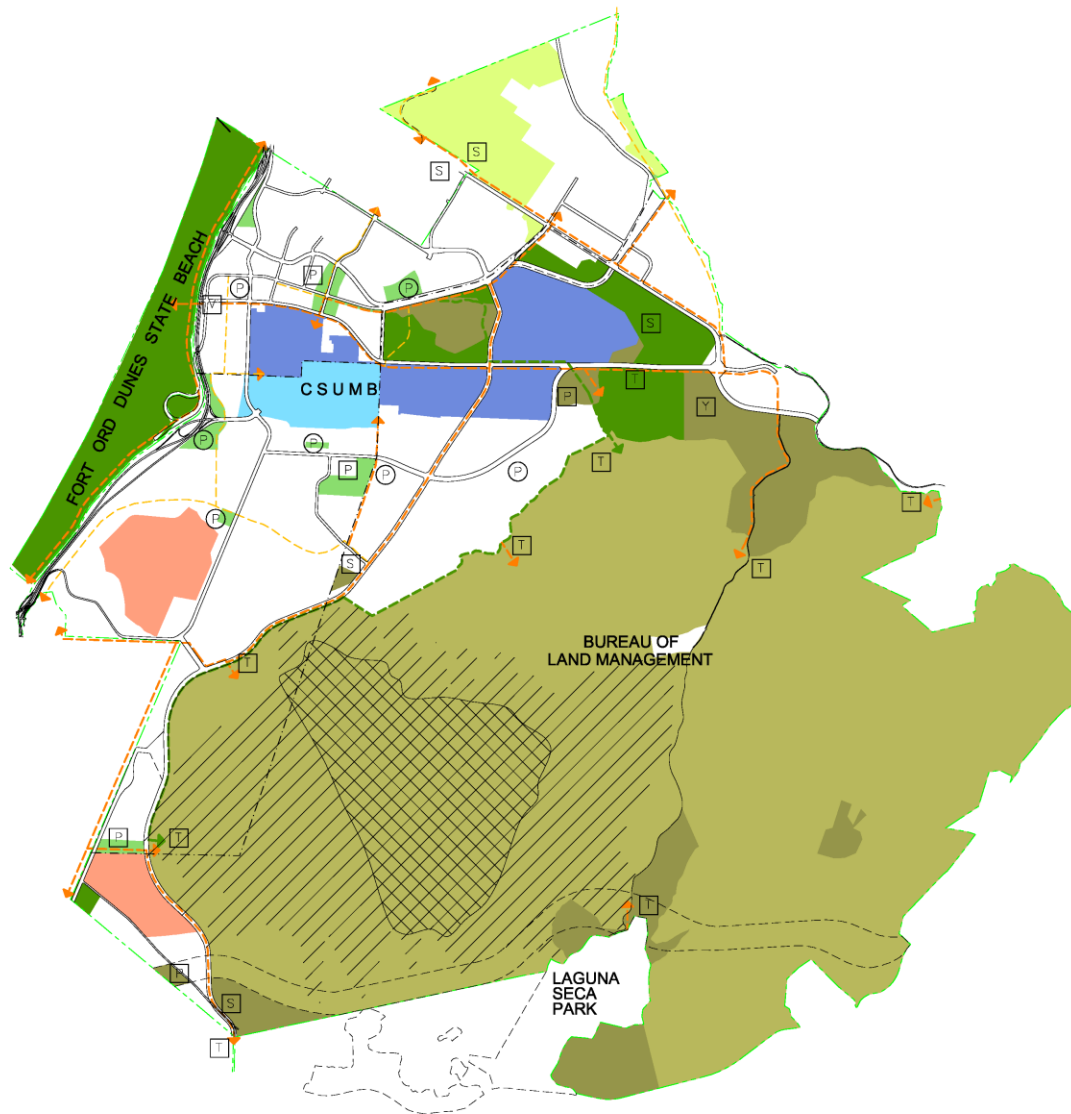

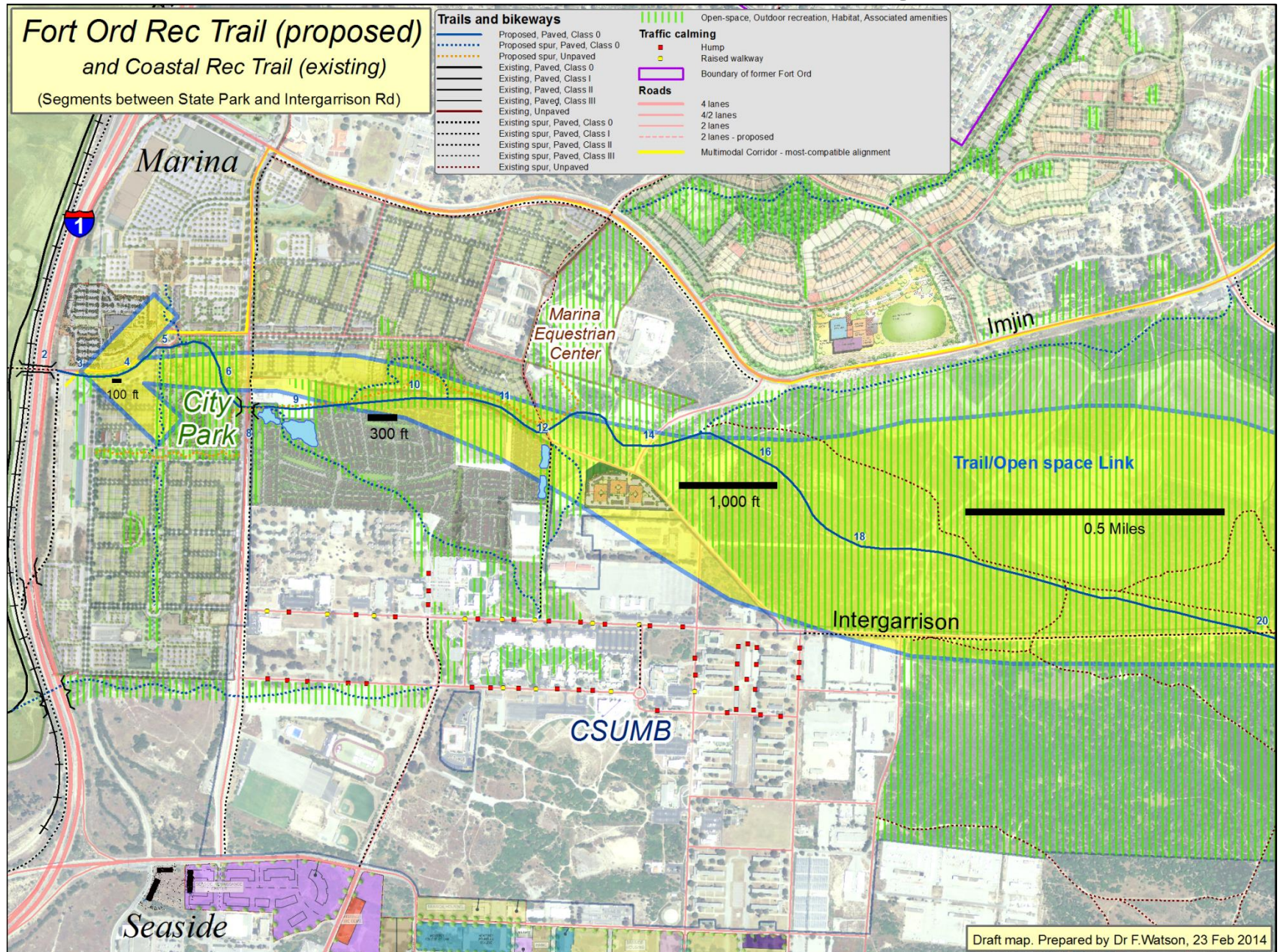
The Fort Ord Rec Trail and Greenway implements the Trail / Open-Space Link and other trailways indicated in the Fort Ord Reuse Plan



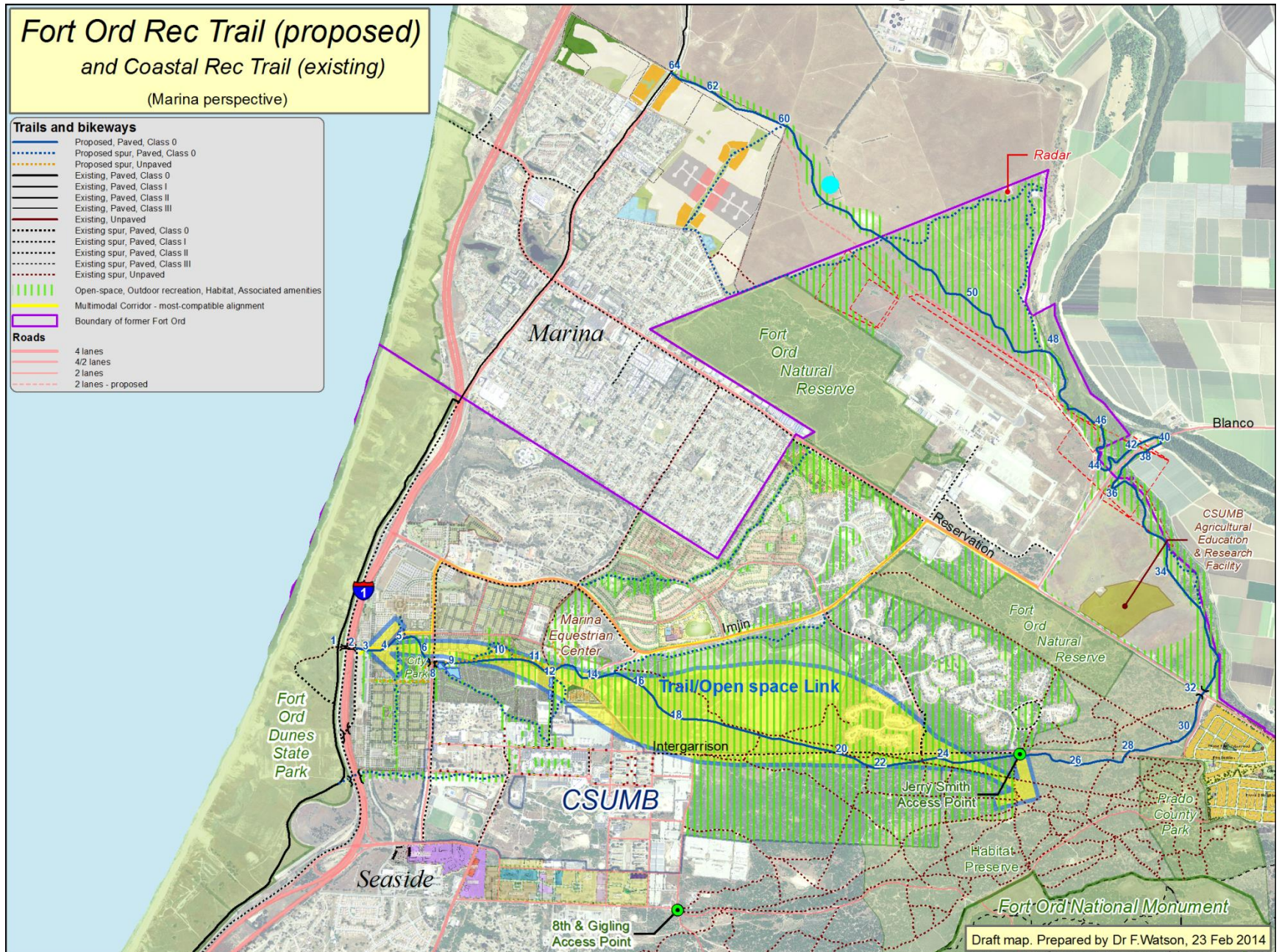
Future population and Regional Parks in the former Fort Ord region

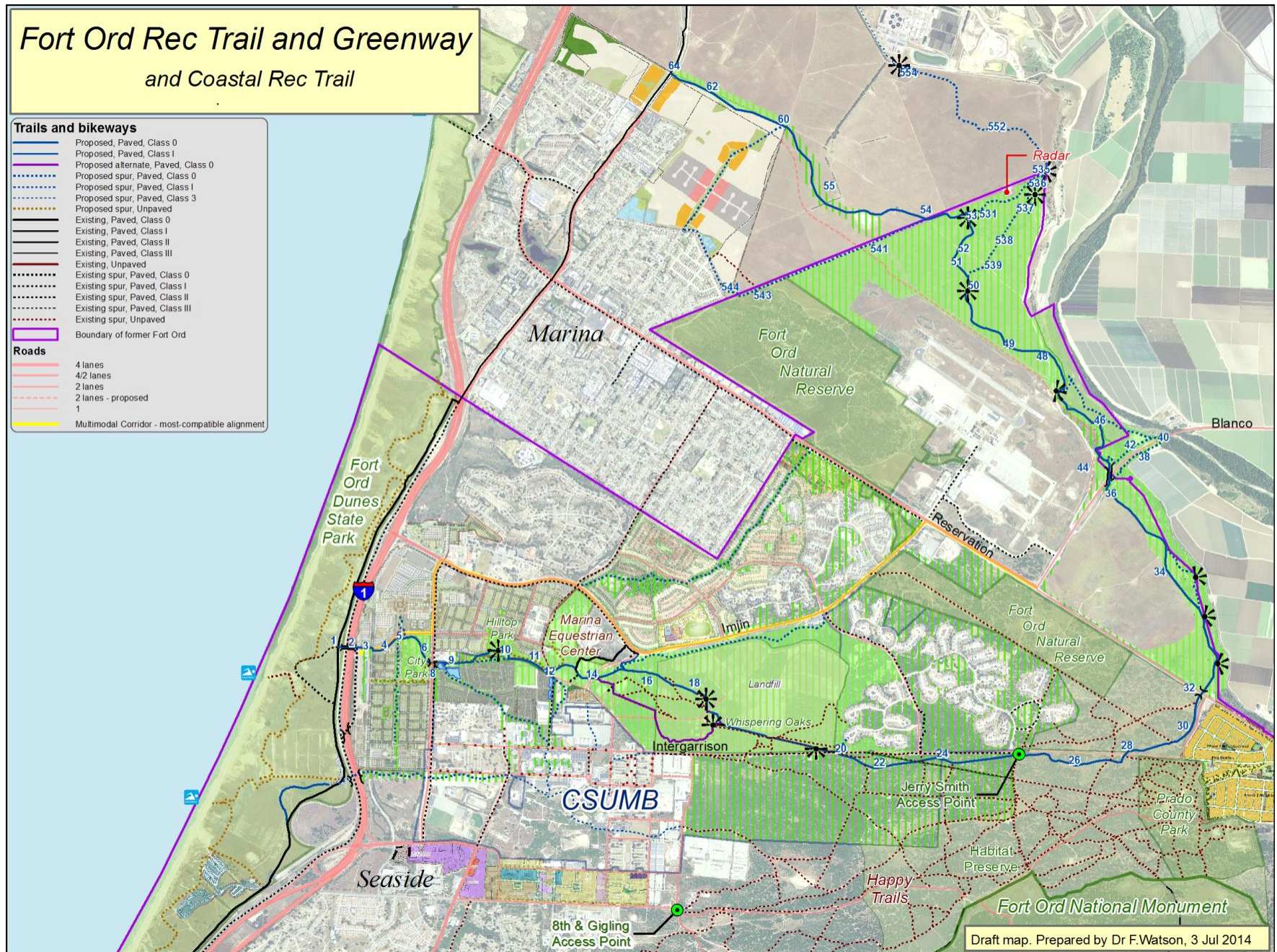

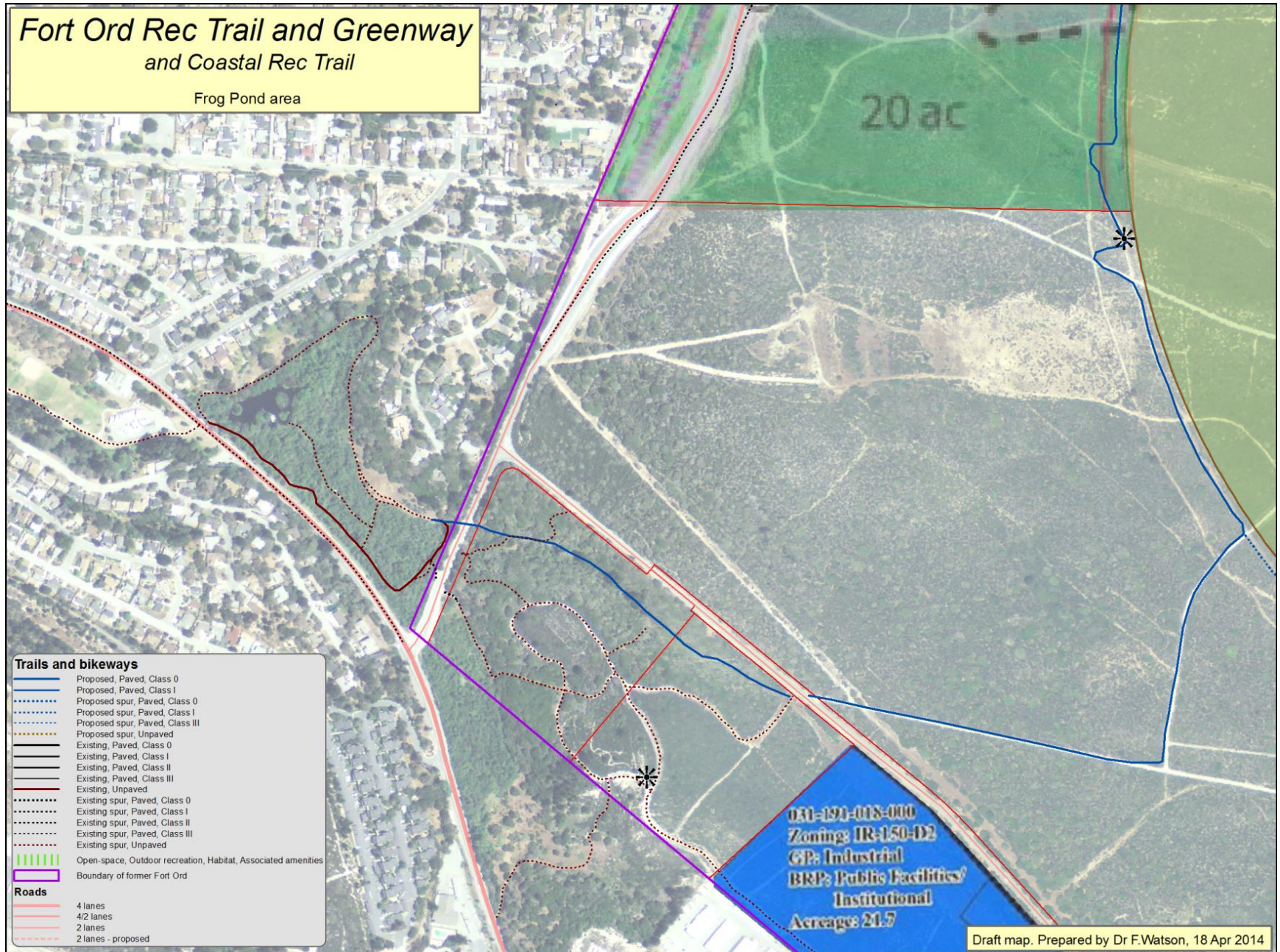

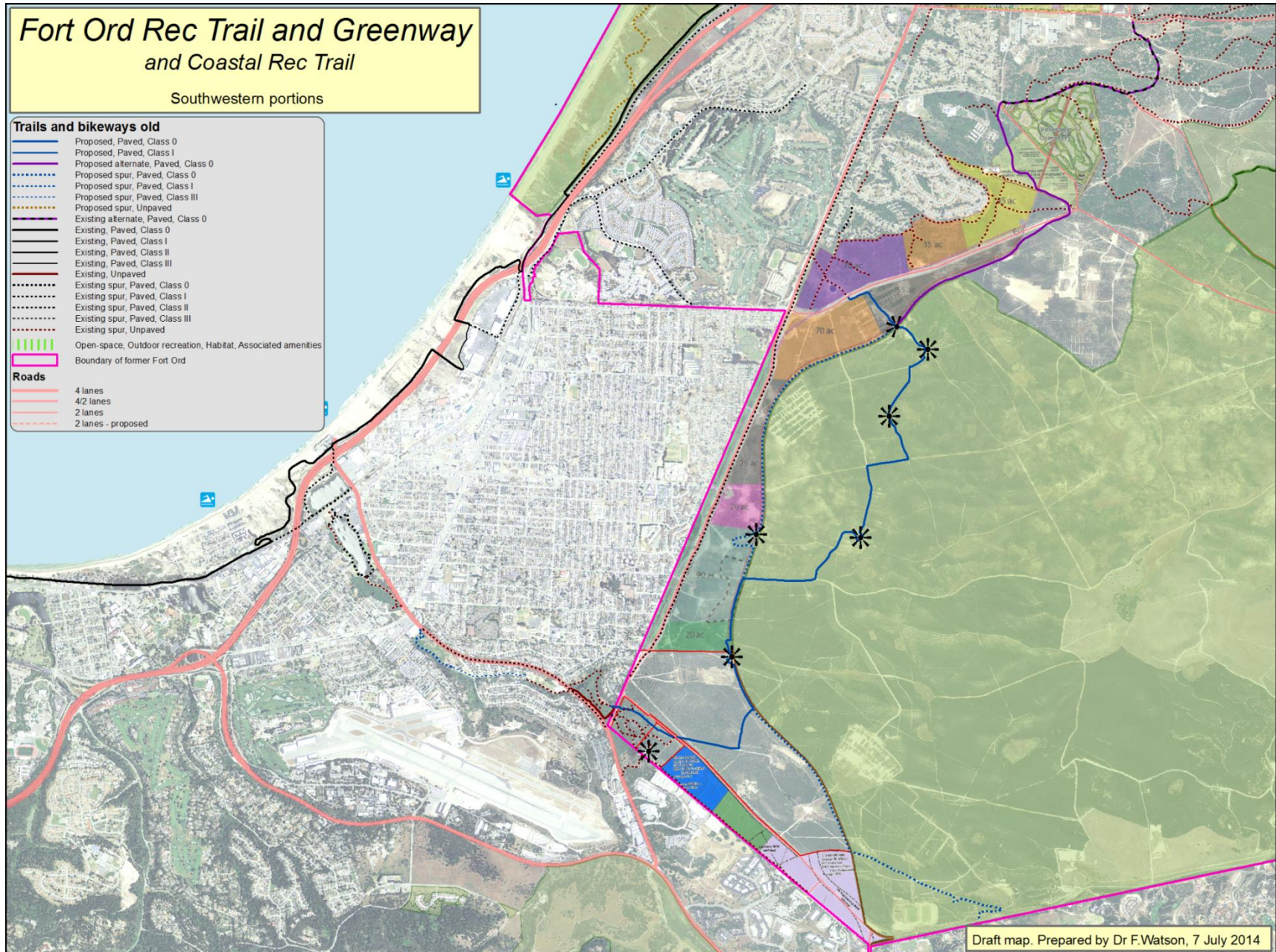

Existing Regional Park property on former Fort Ord: The Frog Pond – Opportunity to be a gateway to Fort Ord from the Monterey side

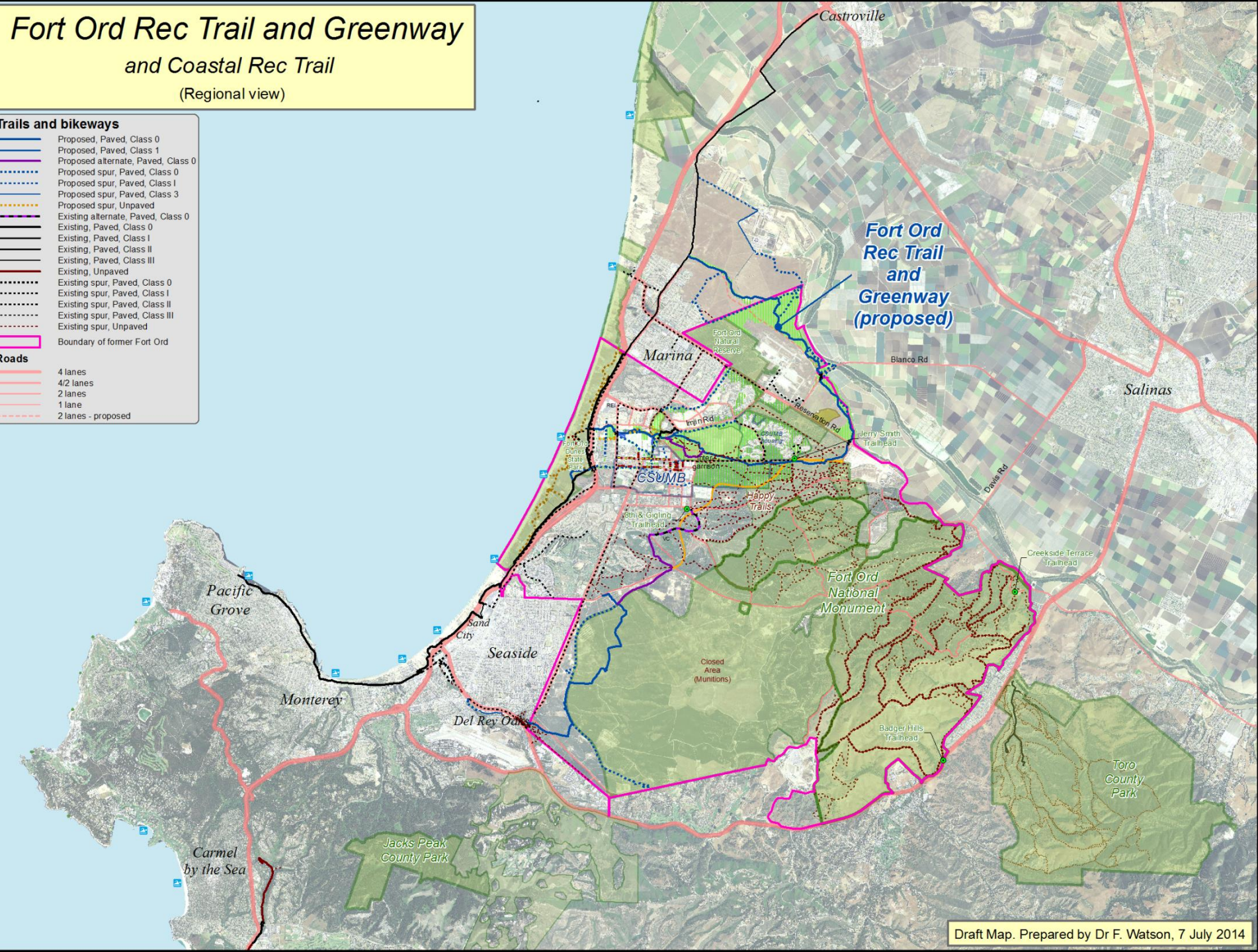

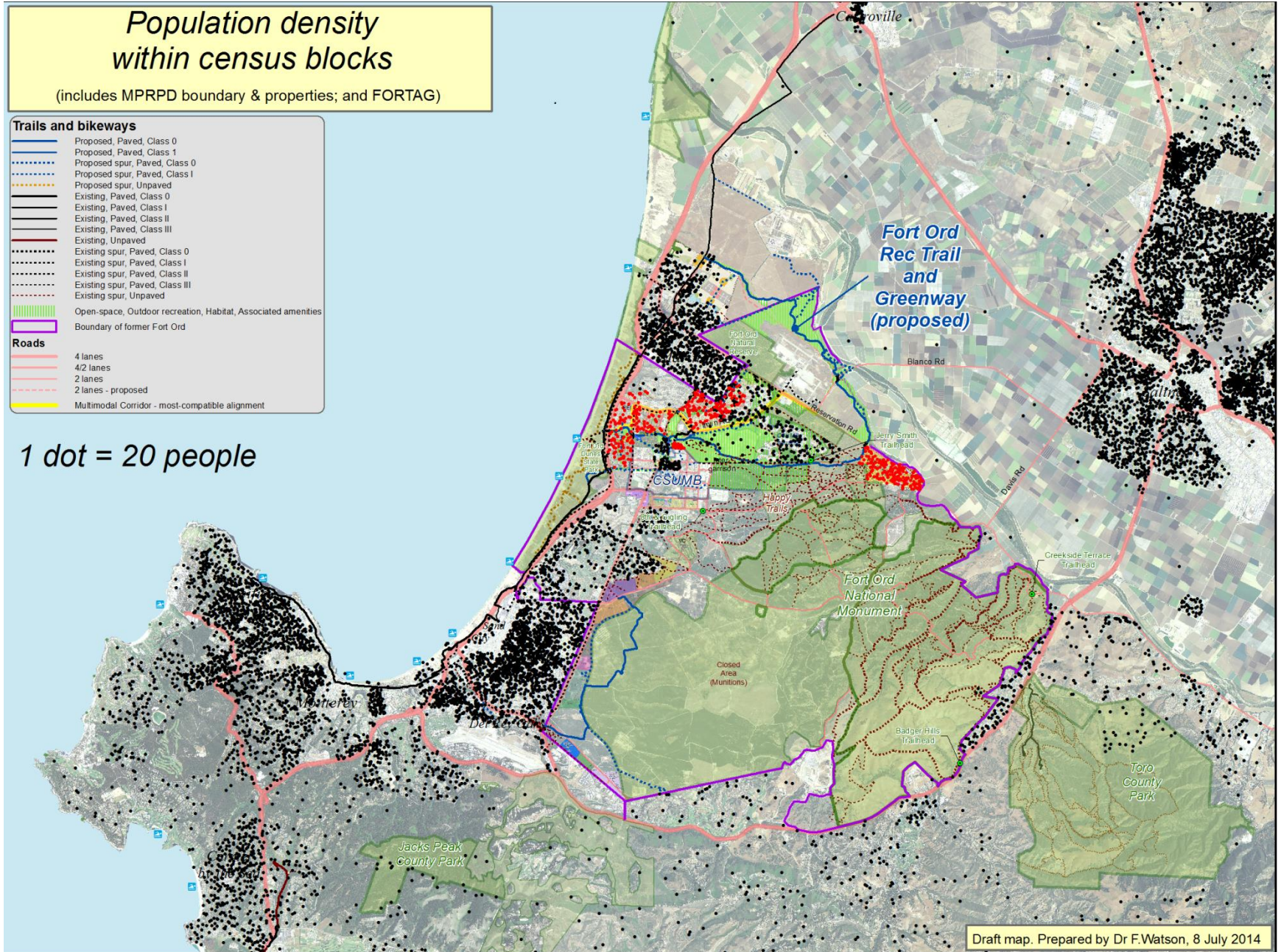

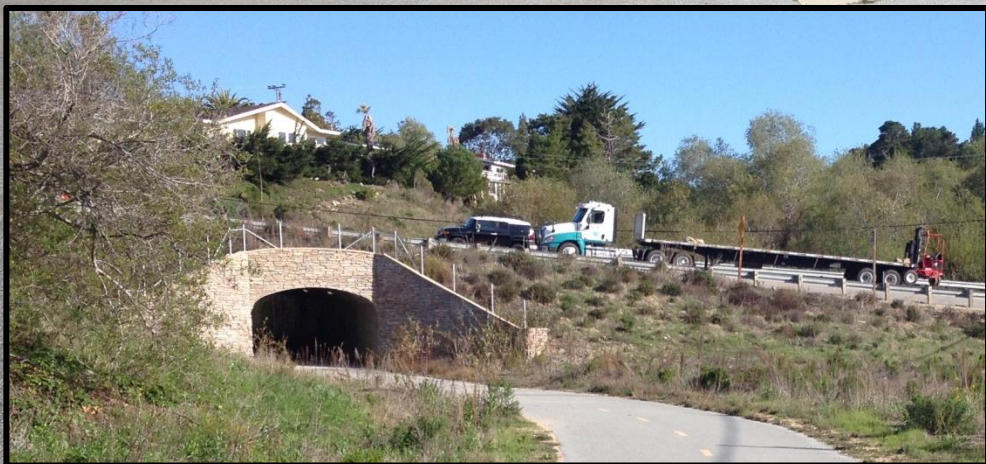


















From Jerry Smith Trailhead to the Salinas River and back to Marina

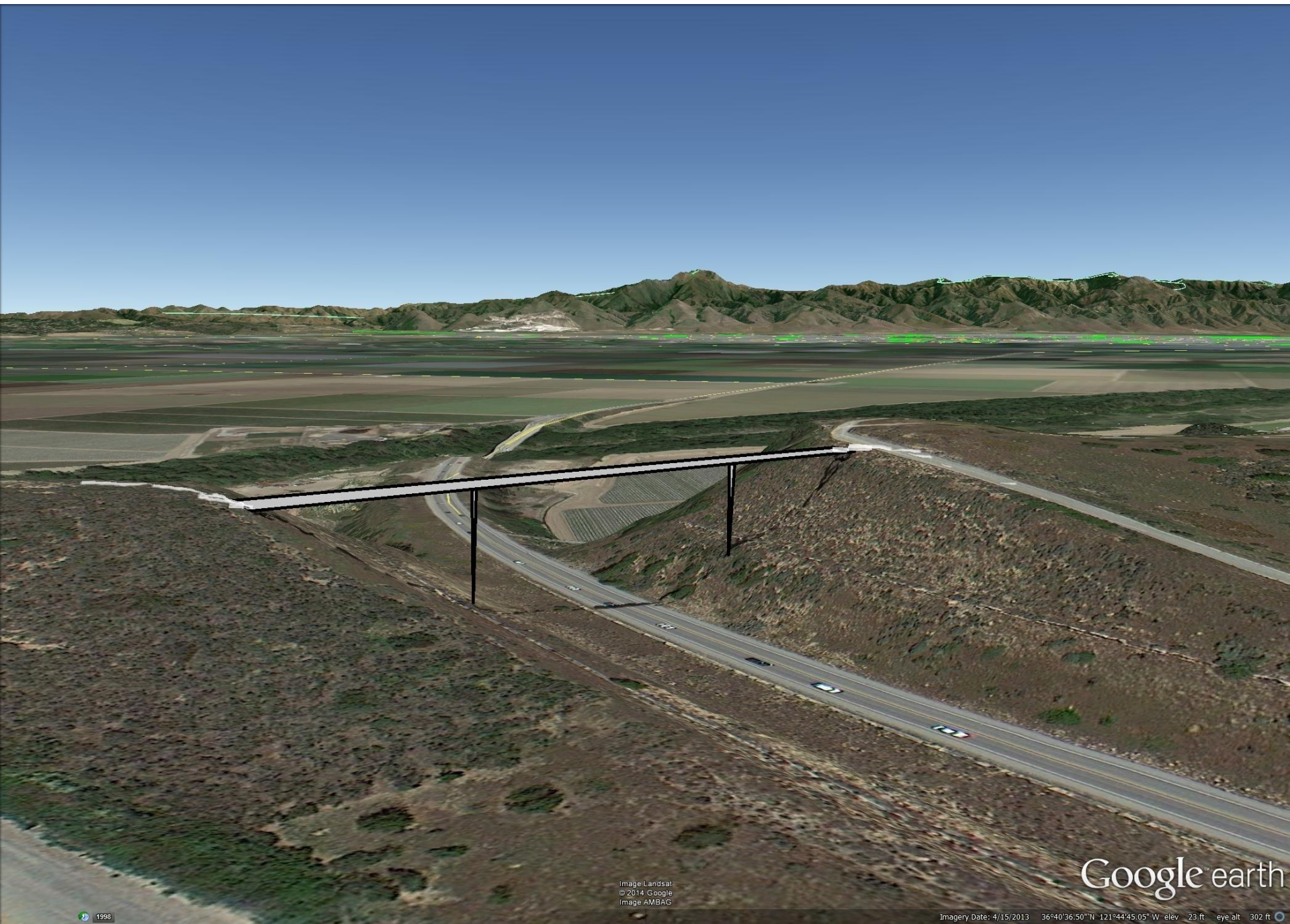

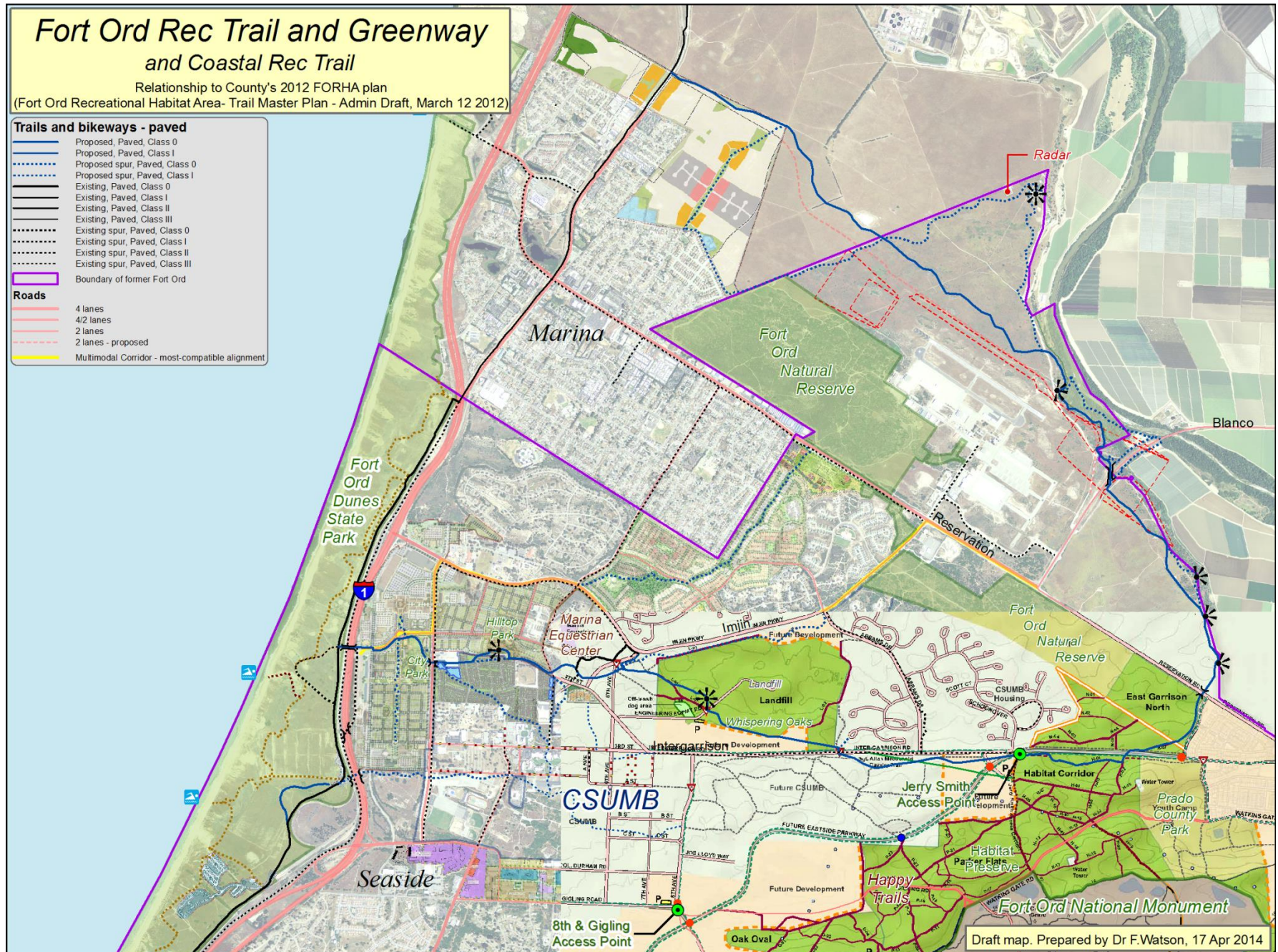

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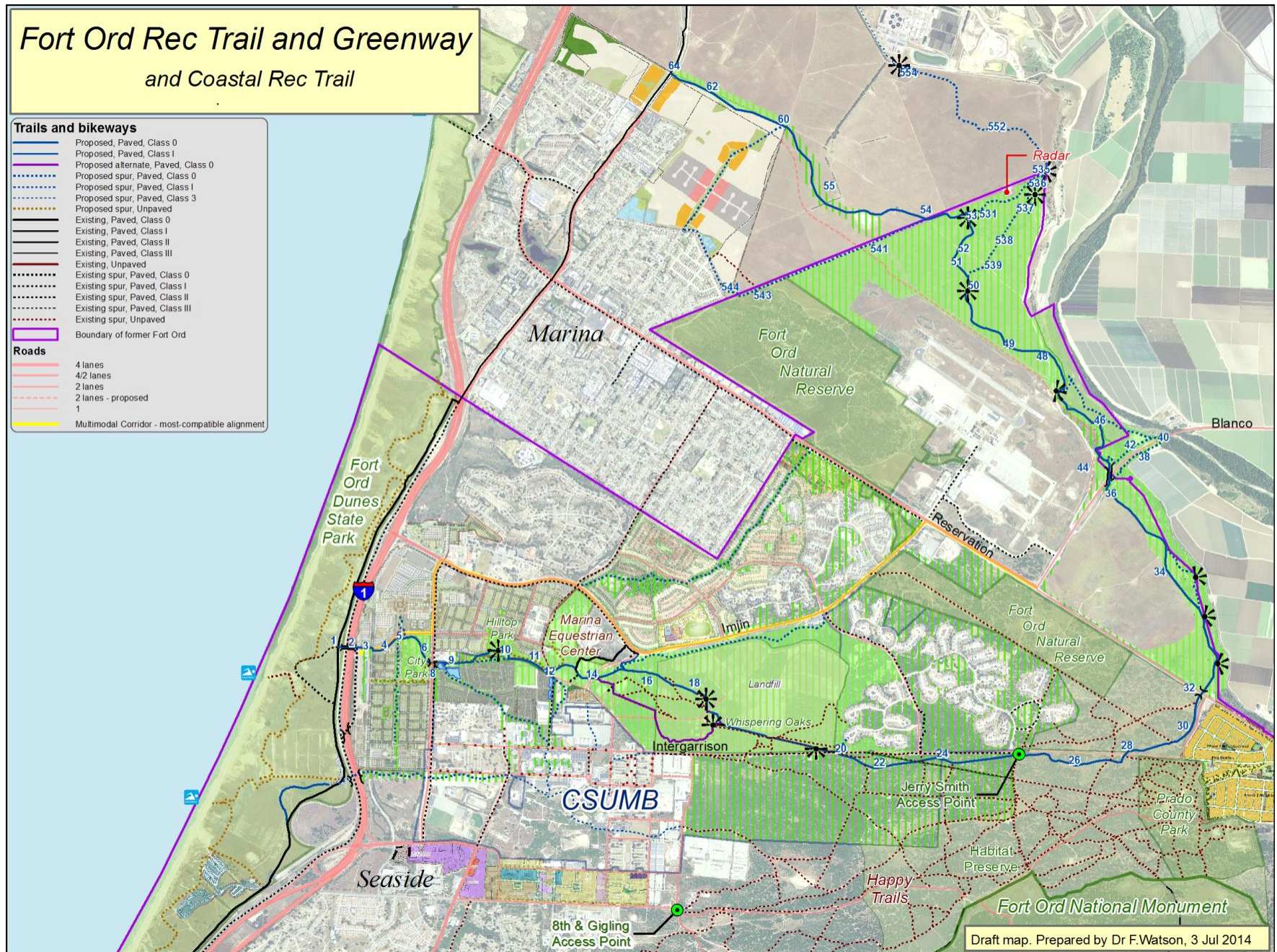
